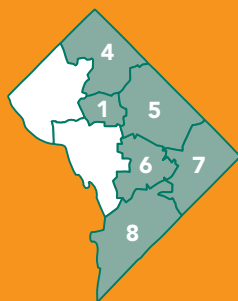

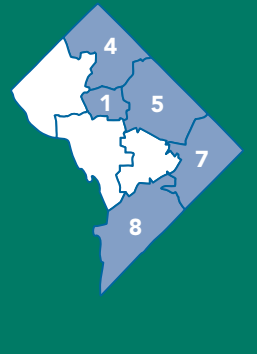

HOW DO I GET A SPACE FOR MY CHILD?

DC charter schools are public schools that are free for all DC residents. Any DC student can attend a DC public charter school that has available space, but families must complete an application to request space at a charter school. When schools have more applicants than available spaces, a lottery determines which students will be offered space.

Introducing My School DC

For this coming school year (2014–15), most DC PK3–12 public charter schools are participating in My School DC.

My School DC is a common application and a common lottery for public charter schools and District of Columbia Public Schools (DCPS). Starting December 16, 2013, families can access the common application at MySchoolDC.org.



FEBRUARY 3, 2014

Deadline for high school (grades 9–12) applications



MARCH 3, 2014

Deadline for early childhood, elementary, and middle school (PK3–grade 8) applications

Key dates

- **December 16, 2013:** Application is available at MySchoolDC.org.
- **February 3, 2014:** Deadline for high school (grades 9–12) applications
- **March 3, 2014:** Deadline for early childhood, elementary, and middle school (PK3–grade 8) applications
- **March 31, 2014:** Lottery results released
- **May 1, 2014:** Deadline to accept a space offered through the lottery. Accepting a space requires turning in all required enrollment forms for the school where you are enrolling, including proof of residency.

EARLY CHILDHOOD AND ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Early childhood and **adult education** public charter school programs work with PCSB to set individual performance targets. PCSB used two methods to measure the performance of these programs: **Accountability Plans** and a **PMF Pilot**.

ABOUT THE PMF

The Performance Management Framework (PMF) measures public charter school performance on several indicators, which are explained below.



LEADING INDICATORS:

Predictors of future student progress and achievement

- Attendance and re-enrollment
- 9th grade credits on track to graduate (high school)
- 20% (elementary and middle) or 25% (high school) of the PMF score

Tier	1	HIGH PERFORMING (65.0–100.0%)
Tier	2	MID PERFORMING (35.0–64.9%)
Tier	3	LOW PERFORMING (0.0–34.9%)



MISSION-SPECIFIC:

Measures related to the unique school mission

- Specified by each school
- Used to evaluate Early Childhood and Adult Education programs



STUDENT PROGRESS:

Test score improvement over time

- Growth on the DC-CAS Reading and Math assessments
- 40% (elementary and middle school) or 15% (high school) of the PMF score



GATEWAY:

Outcomes in key subjects that predict future educational success or outcomes that are aligned to college and career readiness

- Proficient and advanced performance on DC-CAS 3rd grade reading (elementary school)
- Proficient and advanced performance on DC-CAS 8th grade math (middle school)
- Graduation rate, 11th grade PSAT performance, 12th grade SAT performance, and college acceptance rate (high school)
- 15% (elementary and middle school) or 30% (high school) of the PMF score

Meeting or exceeding standards

- Proficient and advanced performance on the DC-CAS Reading and Mathematics assessments
