

LAYC Career Academy PCS provides students with college credits, Advanced Placement-style classes, a rigorous and self-paced GED program, a college preparatory curriculum, and career training in the health care and information technology fields. This school was the first GED school in the country to obtain a grant from the Walton Family Foundation, which is known for its dedication to high-quality college preparatory models.
