Stokes School seeks approval to locate our second campus in the former DCPS Evans Middle School building located at 5600 East Capitol Street, NE in school year 2018-19. The building is currently partially occupied by Maya Angelou Public Charter School. This campus will be a replication of our existing academic program - a dual language immersion program that delivers instruction in English/French or English/Spanish to students in Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

This campus will be the first language immersion charter school to open East of the River. We have coordinated with personnel at Maya Angelou to hold open house sessions and inform prospective families about this new campus. Additionally, we have met with Councilmember Gray's office, Ward 7 ANC commissioners and members as well as members of civics associations in the area to inform them about our program and seek their support.



2. BHow will the amendment(s) selected above support or enhance the school's mission?

Stokes School's mission is to prepare culturally diverse students to be leaders, scholars and responsible citizens who are committed to social justice. We we are currently fulfilling our mission. We have an extremely diverse school community. In 2015 the Washington Post cited our school as one of the most diverse schools in the District of Columbia. We believe that the nature of our language immersion program naturally attracts families from diverse backgrounds and cultures. We also intentional recruit students from various communities throughout the city. Our students have consistently demonstrated academic achievement civic leadership. Since the creation of PCSB;s Performance Management Framework /School Quality Report, our school has achieved either Tier 1 or top Tier 2 status. In our most recent Qualitative Site Review over 90% of our observations were at a distinguished or proficient level. When students graduate from our school they are able to read, write and speak in at least two languages. All of our students engage in service learning activities that benefit local, national and global communities. We believe that we have created a learning environment in which students are able to grow and thrive. However, the number of students that we are able to serve is very limited. Currently, we have few available spaces for incoming students each school year. Because siblings of current students have admission preference, the majority of our available spaces are given to siblings of current students. The proposed amendment will allow us to enhance the mission by increasing significantly the number of new students and families we are able to serve.

We have informed internal and external stakeholders of our intention to replicate through various means. Staff, current and prospective parents have been updated through written communication, i.e., email and newsletters. We have also discussed plans for growth with these stakeholders in meetings, i.e., staff meetings, board meetings, state of the school address, etc. We have also met with external stakeholders including staff from Councilmember Gray's office who expressed support for Stokes School opening in Ward 7. Additionally, Stokes School staff has met with Ward 7 ANC commissioners and members as well as members of civics associations in the area to inform them about our program and seek their support. The Ward 7C07 ANC Commissioner, Antawan Holmes, has expressed his support for the school and has worked to establish a connection between Stokes School and Houston Elementary (the only DCPS school East of the River to offer a language immersion program) in an effort to create cross sector collaboration.

Stokes School staff members have also participated in education fairs in Wards 7 and 8 in an effort to connect with more families in the area. Additionally, the faculty and staff of Maya Angelou PCS have generously allowed Stokes School to

hold multiple open house events in their building to connect with prospective families.

Stokes School currently operates a single site Pre-K through 5th grade language immersion school that serves 350 students and families in the Brookland neighborhood of NE Washington DC. Stokes School proposes to open a second campus within the former DCPS Evans Middle School building located at 5600 East Capital St, NE Washington, DC. The replication of the school program has previously been approved by the PCSB, however, at the time of approval Stokes School had not secured a site. The second campus will be a co-location with the Maya Angelou PCS. Stokes School will occupy the first and second floors of the building. Maya Angelou operates its program on the 3rd and 4th floors of the building.

**3.** Is the proposed new facility a property that you plan to purchase or lease? How many square feet is this space? Which grade level(s) will be at this location?

The proposed facility is owned by the District of Columbia. Maya Angelou PCS leases the building from DC government and has previously renovated the top two floors of the facility. Building Hope will renovate the first and second floors of the building –and lease the space to Stokes School through its Incubator Program. The renovation will take place over the course of a two year period. Upon completion of the first floor renovations during the summer of 2018, Stokes School will open with 4 Pre-K classes and 2 kindergarten classes. During the summer of 2019 renovation of the second floor will be completed allowing the campus to grow to full capacity (pre-k through 5<sup>th</sup> grade) over the course of a 6 year period. The total amount of space that Stokes School will occupy is approximately 32,000 square feet.

The new campus is located in Ward 7 of Washington, DC at 5600 East Capitol Street in the northeast side of the street. Although the building sits on a main thoroughfare, it is surrounded on all sides by residential property. It is located on a Metro bus line and within close proximity to the Capitol Heights Metro station. There is a public charter high school/adult education program (Maya Angelou) located in the same building as the proposed new campus and there is also a pre-k/ elementary/middle charter school located across the street (DC Scholars). DC Scholars is also a high performing charter school that serves PreK and elementary school students. The Stokes School East End campus will bring unique programming to the neighborhood as we will be the only charter school East of the River to offer a language immersion program. Stokes School has met with administrators and staff at Houston Elementary School, the only DCPS immersion program East of the River. The two schools are planning to work collaboratively in the areas of professional development and OST programming.

There has been a tremendous amount of outreach to members of the community where the proposed new facility is located. As previously mentioned, Stokes School administrators have met with Councilmember Gray's office who expressed support for Stokes School opening in Ward 7. Additionally, Stokes School staff has met with Ward 7 ANC commissioners and members as well as the Board of Education President (Ward 7 representative), and members of civics associations in the area to inform them about our program and seek their support. The Ward 7C07 ANC Commissioner, Antawan Holmes, has expressed his support for the school and has worked to establish a connection between Stokes School and Houston Elementary (the only DCPS school East of the River to offer a language immersion program) in an effort to create cross sector collaboration.

There has been overwhelming support for the opening of a second campus in Ward 7. The biggest concerns expressed have been about middle school options (where will the East End Stokes School students attend school when they finish 5<sup>th</sup> grade) d has been supportive of S

In school year 2018-19 there will be 144 seats available in Pre-k and Kindergarten. One grade level and



Papproximately 50 more seats will be added each year until the campus reaches 5<sup>th</sup> grade. There will be a total of 400 seats on that campus at full growth.

Recruitment efforts for the East End campus began two years ago when Stokes School staff participated in Language Immersion fairs East of the River and inform families of the school's intent to open a second campus in the future. Last school year and this school year Stokes School's recruitment efforts have included advertisement on the radio and in local newspapers – The Hill Rag, East of the River, as well as the Informer. We have also held multiple open house sessions and school tours at our Brookland location as well as the Maya Angelou PCS building. We have participated in citywide education fairs as well as ward 7 and 8 specific education fairs. We have also recruited at community centers and day care centers in Wards 7 and 8. Our recruitment efforts yielded more than 2000 applications this year's lottery.

9. What is the occupancy maximum at the new location? If the maximum occupancy load for staff and students is less than the total number of staff and students who will occupy the facility at any point in the future, please explain how you will address this issue.

As renovation has not been completed in the proposed facility, we do not yet have a certificate of occupancy. However, the square footage that will be available to us upon the completion of the work will be sufficient to house 400 students as well as their teachers, administrators and support staff.

**10.** How will the proposed change impact the school's operations and finances? What are the anticipated expenses, and how will the school finance these expenses?

Expenses will increase with the addition of the second campus but revenue will also increase. Our biggest long-term expenses will be for personnel (salaries, benefits, professional development, etc.) and costs relating to the facility. Short term expenses will include all of the materials, supplies and equipment needed to get the school up and running. In addition to the increases that we will receive in the UPSFF and facilities funding, we have also secured several grants to support this replication including grants from the Charter School Growth Fund, Education Forward DC and a Charter school replication grant.
