

DC PCSB Committed to Increasing Floors

- National pass rates demonstrate need to increase floors for Secondary Credential and GED Subject Test measures (see Slide 5)
- Ultimate goal is to fully honor meaning of tiers
 - Tier 1: exceeding expectations
 - o Tier 2: meeting expectations
 - Tier 3: not meeting expectations

2017-18 Secondary Credential & GED Subject Test Alignment

Proposal


- Continue using 2016-17 GED Subject Test floor-setting business rule on 2017-18 PMF
- Apply the 2016-17 GED Subject Test floorsetting business rule to the 2017-18 Secondary Credential measure
- On both measures
 - \circ Floor = 40
 - \circ Target = 100



Recall: 2016-17 GED Subject Test Business Rule

The floor is based on setting 70%, the probability of passing the GED given a "likely to pass" score on the GED Ready, at 50% of the range between the floor and target.
