Proposal

DC PCSB staff recommends the Board vote to open [the 2017-18 Performance Management Framework Policy & Technical Guide](#) (PMF Guide) for public comment from February 22, 2018 through March 19, 2018. Any public comment received during the public comment period will be taken into consideration prior to the vote.

Anyone wishing to present their testimony publicly before the Board may do so during the public hearing on February 26, 2018. The Board will vote at the March 19, 2018 meeting pending no comments received that the Board needs more time to consider.

Summary of Proposed PMF Guide Revisions

This proposal focuses on two parts. 1) PK-8 PMF: To protect the Performance Management Framework's year-to-year stability, DC PCSB staff recommends the Board amend the 2017-18 PMF Guide to revert to the weights, floors and

targets business rules in the 2016-17 PMF Guide for the Student Achievement and Gateway measures. 2) AE PMF: To correct an error in the Adult Education (AE) PMF Retention measure business rule that allowed a GED or NEDP test to count for a post-test that was approved by the task force for the 2017-18 PMF Guide and to clarify that a student must pre- and post-test in the same Adult Basic Education (ABE) subject for Student Progress.

PK-8 PMF

This proposal keeps the reliability of the Framework for all PK-8 schools with the average impact of 0.0 percentage points and the range of 0.6 points total (-0.4 to +0.2). Appendix A shows the impact analysis for every school based on 2016-17 data.

Achievement Weights

2016-17 Weights:

There is a three-to-two ratio of weights between PARCC Approaching College and Career Ready (levels 3+) and PARCC College and Career Ready (levels 4+).

2017-18 Weights:

PARCC levels 3+ and PARCC levels 4+ weigh equal.

The table below shows the weights for the Student Achievement measures for 2016-17 and 2017-18 for all grade configurations outlined in the technical guides. The weights below are for each subject, math and ELA.

Floor: The 3.3rd percentile, three-year weighted average¹

Target: PARCC Levels 3+ set at 100, PARCC Levels 4+ = 90th percentile, three-year weighted average

The table below shows the 2016-17 floors and targets, the 2017-18 floors and targets using the new business rules, and the proposed 2017-18 floors and targets using the 2016-17 business rules. The targets for 2016-17 include PARCC data through 2015-16 and the targets calculated for 2017-18 (approved and proposed) include charter school PARCC data through 2016-17.

We recommend the Board use the 2016-17 floors and targets for the School Environment measures: Attendance and re-enrollment.

AE PMF

Additionally, staff clarified the Adult Education (AE) PMF Student Progress and Retention measures.

Student Progress

Last year, the Board approved setting a minimum post-test participation rate for the Student Progress category. As written in the approved 2017-18 PMF Guide, “[s]chools must post-test a minimum of 60% of eligible students to receive points for this measure...” To promote post-testing in students’ lowest scoring Adult Basic Education (ABE) or ESL subject, DC PCSB staff recommend the following clarification be added to pages 86 and 94 of the PMF Guide:

To count toward the post-test participation rate, students must, at a minimum, be post-tested in their lowest performing subject.

¹ The three-year weighted average is calculated as follows: the most recent year has 50% weight, the previous year has 30% weight, and the year prior to that has 20% weight.

Retention

Last year, the Adult Education PMF task force recommended and the Board approved the following Student Progress adjustment: in addition to demonstrating growth through an NRS post-test assessment, students who earn their National External Diploma Program (NEDP) credential or pass the GED subject test that corresponds to their lowest performing ABE subject will also be positively counted (as long as they do not post-test on an NRS-approved assessment). Since the NEDP and GED subject test counts as the students' post-test, we intended to count it the same way in the Retention measure. We clarified that the NEDP attainment and passing GED subject test can be counted as the post-test for Retention. The following language was added to page 112:

In alignment with the Student Progress measure described on page 92, in lieu of an NRS-approved post-test, a student may be counted as retained if they earn the NEDP credential or pass the GED subject test that corresponds to their lowest performing ABE subject during the program year and they do not post-test after earning the NEDP or passing said GED subject test.

Background

In September 2017, the Board approved the 2017-18 PMF Guide per DC PCSB staff recommendation. At the time, DC PCSB staff simulated the recommended changes using data from school year 2015-16 (the most recent data available at the time). We projected the PK-8 campuses would lose an average of 0.7 PMF points. Since then, we simulated the approved changes using the newly available school year 2016-17 data. We now project that PK-8 campuses would lose an average of 1.9 PMF points. Additionally, we determined that some schools would lose as many as 7.7 PMF points, while others would gain as many as 2.2 points. Appendix B shows the impact analysis for every school based on 2016-17 data with the previously approved floors and targets. While DC PCSB staff recommend adjustments to the PMF Guide almost annually, we have not recommended changes that result in such dramatic performance shifts. The Framework is most valuable when it has stability, allowing stakeholders to rely on its outputs over multiple school years.

On January 18, 2018, DC PCSB staff met with the PK-8 task force to share our findings and discuss proposals.² An overwhelming majority (87.5%) of schools approved our proposal to revert to the 2016-17 PARCC weights, floors and targets, and to hold the School Environment floors and targets steady for one more year.³

Additionally, 71.4% of the LEAs that submitted feedback requested DC PCSB consider removing outliers prior to calculating the PARCC 4+ targets. DC PCSB staff do not recommend removing outliers. If we removed outliers, overall PMF scores will change drastically, with an average PMF score increase of 1.9 points,

and a range of 5.0 points (-0.1 to +4.9 points). This is precisely the kind of shift DC PCSB seeks to avoid in making its proposal to revert to 2016-17 PARCC floors and targets.

Appendix B: PK – 8 Impact Analysis of the Previously Approved Changes

Based on the already approved changes for 2017-18 PMF Guide, based on the 2016-17 data, schools would lose an average 1.9% on their overall PMF scores; the maximum change to the overall PMF scores was -7.7% to +2.8%. Eight schools would see their Tier drop.
