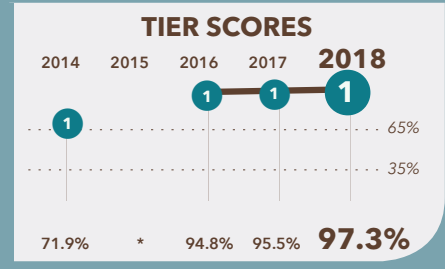

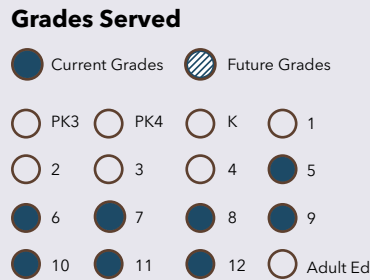

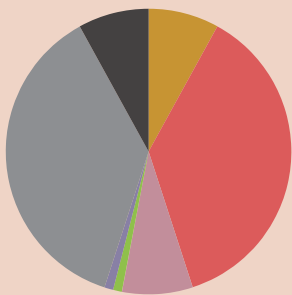
Tier Explanations

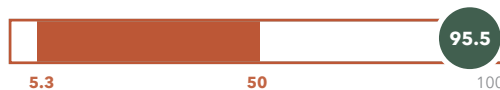

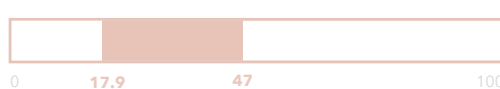

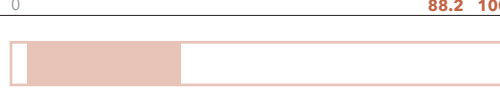

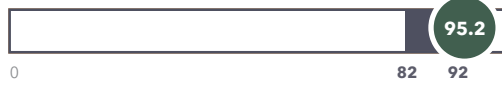
