### SUBJECT: Revisions to DC PCSB's Accreditation Policy: Open for 30 Days of Public Comment

#### DATE: June 25, 2018

#### <u>Proposal</u>

The DC Public Charter School Board (DC PCSB) staff recommends its Board vote to open for public comment the revised Accreditation Policy, which adds a requirement that schools with residential education programs<sup>1</sup> must obtain accreditation for their residential education programs as well as for their day programs.

DC PCSB is scheduled to hold a public hearing on this matter on July 23, 2018 and will close the public comment period after the hearing is held. The Board will vote on the proposed policy on September 17, 2018.

# **Policy Revision**

The revised policy clarifies that all programs of education at public charter schools, including the residential education program, must be accredited. Revisions to the policy will include the following language:

Schools with residential education programs must obtain accreditation for their residential education programs in addition to their day programs, following the timeline established under this policy. A currently accredited school with a Board-approved residential education program must ensure that its residential program is fully accredited no later than July 31, 2019. A school with a residential program that is in the accreditation "candidacy phase" by January 1, 2021 must also pursue accreditation for its residential programs by the end of the ninth year of operation.

The revised policy is included as Attachment A. The existing policy can be found on our website <u>here</u>.

## **Background**

There are currently three public charter schools approved to operate residential programs in Washington, DC: SEED Public Charter School PCS, Maya Angelou PCS, and Monument Academy PCS. DC PCSB staff held two meetings with leaders of these schools to discuss improvements to DC PCSB staff monitoring of residential education programs.
