We believe that using the PMF as the basis for our 15-year renewal will streamline the overall renewal process. While E.L. Haynes has strong evidence to submit in support of meeting our current charter goals, we believe the lengthy process of working with PCSB to establish business rules for each metric will require substantial time and resources (i.e staff time and focus).

Our current goals are aligned to our mission and values, and represent our broader philosophy as a school. However, we believe adopting the PMF as our charter goals will sufficiently measure the core academic components of our program for purposes of our 15-year renewal. E.L. Haynes will continue to track our progress against our commitments (and mission aligned goals) internally to ensure we continue to focus on our broader mission as a school.
