PROPOSAL

Latin American Montessori Bilingual Public Charter School submits to the DC Public Charter School Board this application to amend its charter agreement by changing the item(s) selected above. The Latin American Montessori Bilingual Public Charter School (LAMB PCS) is requesting a charter amendment in order to adopt the DC Public Charter School Board PMF Goals. Additionally, LAMB PCS will utilize the Teacher Interaction, Classroom Organization and Instructional Support scores from CLASS for the Early Childhood Measure.

LAMB PCS' adoption of the PK-8 PMF will be retroactive and DC PCSB will hold the school accountable to the PK-8 PMF as its goals and student academic achievement expectations, including the recently approved Hold Harmless Clause¹ starting in school year 2012-13 and beyond. Based on its performance record LAMB has met its goals and academic achievement expectations:

- LAMB's average PMF score for SY 2012-13, 2013-14, 2015-16, and 2016-17 is equal to or exceeds 50% (excluding results from SY 2014-15, as this was hold harmless); and
- LAMB PCS has met the floor of all Early Childhood (EC) PMF measures in SY 2013-14.

LAMB PCS's past PMF scores are as follows:

¹ Hold Harmless Provision: On December 14, 2015 the DC PCSB board approved of the amendment to the 2014-15 PMF Technical Guide to update the Hold Harmless Provision to state that "PCSB will not score or tier the EC/ES/MS or HS PMF for the 2014-15 PMF. The school's performance on each measure will be displayed separately without percentages of total points."



2. How will the proposed amendment(s) support or enhance the school's mission?

LAMB PCS is requesting the charter amendment to revise its charter goals and academic achievement expectations by adopting the DC PCSB PK-8 Performance Management Framework Goals. For several years, LAMB has been in conversation with DC PCSB regarding its goals as submitted within the original charter application of which there were fifteen broad goals.

The proposed amendment better enables LAMB PCS and the DC PCSB to track, monitor and measure its goals, as well as to report out to its stakeholders regarding its performance. It is in this spirit of greater clarity and transparency that LAMB is adopting the DC PCSB PMF SMART goals.

Approximately two years ago, LAMB PCS came before the DC PCSB to request an enrollment ceiling increase. At that time, the DC PCSB granted the request and urged LAMB PCS to consider extending its enrollment policy to include kindergarten age students based on several community comments. Prior to that LAMB only enrolled students at PK3 and PK4 as research pointed to 5 to 7 years as basic practices for students to gain full biliteracy (prodiciency in reading, writing and speaking a second language).

In addition, LAMB classrooms are multi-aged. As a result, there are very few open slots for kindergarten students as kindergarten slots are filled by already enrolled PK4 students promoted to the next level. Nonetheless, LAMB PCS extended its enrollment ages to include kindergarten age students and this year enrolled 2 new kindergarten students.
