

Notice of Request to Amend Charter: Campus Name Change – **Center City PCS** Open for Public Comment

Public Comment Accepted Until November 21, 2022

SUMMARY: The District of Columbia Public Charter School Board (DC PCSB) announces an opportunity for the public to comment on a request from Center City Public Charter School (PCS) to amend its charter agreement. The school proposes renaming its Center City PCS – Trinidad campus ahead of school year (SY) 2023 – 24. The proposed name is Center City PCS – NoMa. The school submitted its request on September 28, 2022; the school updated its request on October 24, 2022.¹

Center City PCS opened in 2008. The school educates over 1,400 students across six facilities in Wards 4, 5, 6, and 8. Per its mission, Center City PCS "empowers students for lifelong success by building strong character, promoting academic excellence, and generating public service throughout Washington, DC."
