## **Annual Report Narrative**

### I. School Description

#### A. Mission Statement:

Truth's mission is to empower students to transform the world. Students at Truth will graduate ready for success in college, career, and life. They will serve as active agents in the construction of peace. They will know who they are, what they want, and where they are going. They can walk into any space, find their place, and make a powerful contribution. Truth will achieve this through a Montessori education that fosters student-led classrooms through appropriate environmental structure, enables students to engage in meaningful work with real world applications, and offers a close-knit community where students pursue justice and practice stewardship.

### B. School Program:

# 1. Summary of curriculum design and instructional approach:

The Sojourner Truth School builds on the Montessori commitment to deep, personalized learning through carefully designed classroom environments and freedom within limits. We expand this time-tested model into secondary education by combining an emphasis on personalized learning with an understanding of the skills and tools that a diverse population of middle schoolers (and high schoolers in 2022-2023) need to be successful students, leaders, and citizens. Specifically, we meet adolescents' developmental need for authentic social interaction and meaningful work with real-life applications.

All aspects of Truth - from instructional model, to physical environment, to school culture - are anchored by our four core values: (1) Honor self development, (2) Pursue justice everywhere, (3) Design for positive impact, and (4) Challenge the mind, body, and spirit.

### 2. Parent involvement efforts

Truth has monthly Community Meetings, where all stakeholders are invited to meet with school leadership and various staff members to get the latest updates on school events, culture, academic achievement, and progress monitoring towards school-wide goals.

Truth also has an active Family Association which all guardians and parents are invited to join. The Family Association engages on topics including academic achievement, school development, the planning of social events, fundraising, and Montessori philosophy. (In addition, two members of Truth's Board of Trustees are parents.)

### II. School Performance

### A. Performance and Progress

### 1. The extent to which the school is meeting its mission

We are proud of our accomplishments and the progress made towards meeting our mission during SY2021-2022, which was just our second year of operation and our very first year of fully in-person learning. It was also our first year with a full 6th-8th grade middle school, and average RIT growth on the NWEA MAP test showed over a full year's growth for students in both math and reading. Achievement gaps in NWEA MAP reading were narrowed over the course of the year for at-risk students compared to their peers, EL students compared to their peers, students with disabilities compared to their peers, and students of color compared to their white peers. We expanded our on-campus farm, and we launched our student-run Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) share program to distribute Truth-grown produce and fresh eggs from our chicken coop.

## 2. The extent to which the school is meeting its goals and academic achievement expectations in its charter

Truth has adopted the PMF as goals, and also has a teacher credentialing goal that, by year 5, 80% of core content teachers will either hold a secondary Montessori teaching credential or be enrolled in an AMI/AMS credentialing

program. During SY2021-2022, of our 8 core content teachers, 50% completed secondary Montessori programs and received their AMS or AMI diplomas. An additional 25% received Montessori coursework certificates through AMI, and the remaining 25% are scheduled for coursework in the upcoming year.

With respect to the PMF, Truth used the NWEA MAP assessment for BOY, MOY, and EOY testing and took the PARCC assessment in the spring. Truth's In-Seat Attendance rate was 84.25%, and Truth's Re-enrollment rate was 85%.

### **B.** Unique Accomplishments

In SY2021-2022 Truth expanded to become a full middle school with grades 6-8, and continued plans to open its first high school class of 9th graders for SY2022-2023. Despite being in just its second year of operation, Truth was again overenrolled, launched a vibrant interscholastic sports program with multiple sports each season, has a very diverse student body, and expanded its active Family Association. In addition, Truth was proud to average more than a year's growth for students on NWEA MAP in both reading and math, and to shrink gaps in reading between every monitored subgroup.
