

Summer 2022

A 21st Century Learning Center for students

- Funded by 21st Century Community Learning Center
- Serving approx. 100 students
- July 5th July 29th providing over 180 program hours from 7:30am -5:30pm Monday - Friday.
- 600 hours of intensive small group academic instruction daily by veteran teachers targeting specific learning gaps.
- Partnership with HoopEd
- Families are eligible once they have completely enrolled for SY22-23.



Operations/Finance



Enrollment: SY22 - 23

Enrollment for SY 22-23

- Target enrollment is 485 students. Current enrollment is 450 students. We have enrolled 326 families todate (67%) of target.
- 59% of current families have already completed Re-Enrollment for SY22-23 as of May 11th.
- 45 new students have enrolled through DC lottery and 50 new families are in the process of enrolling. Received **233** applications in lottery (+29% from March 2021)
- Anticipate needing to fill about 70-100 seats with new families.

- 82% of staff are returning, Non returning members include 11 instructional staff members and 2 other staff members. (2 midyear job changes, 6 moving/career changes, and 7 non-renewals).

Finance Committee

YTD Financials

School finances continue to be strong and anticipated on track with SY22 budget.

• **SY22 finances** on track with the support of ESSER II and ESSER III grant funding to support the excess costs of reopening and additional staffing needs. Grant funding will offset anticipated enrollment revenue loses for net income. Additional leasehold improvements carried into this fiscal year in addition to investment in our Prek Program opening caused a negative variance to our cash at end of year in the forecast but we still anticipate a positive net income and positive cash balance at year end.

Budget SY22-23

The finance committee seek a Board vote for the SY22-23 Budget.

- FY23 Budget Highlights
 - Revenue: 485 students, steady special populations and federal grants, 5.9% UPSFF increase anticipated, 50% of ESSER III funds carried forward from SY22
 - Expenses: Stable staffing levels from SY22, student expense increase consistent with student growth, Prek program start up costs and elimination of prior prek management fees.
 - Bottom line: Positive net income and year end cash position.
- As budget is drafted, will enter FY23 with an estimated cash balance of 3.5M and end the year with cash balance of 3.9M- see next slide for investment proposals.

Budget SY22-23 - Investment proposals

Two options for cash investment to bathroom improvements. We received received 4 responses to a RFP to inform this proposal.)

- Option 1: 1 Year invest of \$1.5M in FY24 for complete renovation of 16 bathrooms.
- Option 2: Two-year investment of \$750K FY23 and \$750K FY24 to complete the renovation of 16 additional bathrooms.
- Note: approx. \$400K was invested in FY21 to renovate 2 bathrooms and \$100K is grant funded for bathroom renovations in FY22.



Academics Committee



SY 22-23 Priorities

New Pre-K Program	We are excited to lead the Pre-K program next school year! Our former Kindergarten teacher will be leading the charge to ensure we have a strong start. We are also in the process of calling all pre-k families to let them know we are new and improved!
Curriculum	Next year we will be primarily using the curriculum vetted by Tensquare. This year teachers were allowed to use the curriculum and supplemental activities. We found that teachers using the curriculum with fidelity were more successful in the classroom. Every teacher will be trained and ready to go day one of school. ELA: K-5 - Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA), 6-8 is Amplify Math: Illustrative Mathematics K-8
Attendance	As you know attendance this year has been significantly lower that prior years. We are going to start the push for attendance at the beginning of the year. We also will hold attendance meetings to discuss every child truant, chronically absent or tardy frequently. An identified challenge this year was families accepting high absence rates due to COVID related reasons.
Small Group Instruction	Next year will be challenging. Students have experienced significant loss. Small group instruction will be the focus. As soon as we review MAP baseline data, PARCC, attendance, and reading levels, we will then group students to meet their academic needs.
Additional PE Teacher	In order to meet the guidance under HSA, we are excited to add an additional PE teacher to our staff. We are prioritizing "play" next school year to give students the opportunity to move as much as possible.
New Director of Student Support	We've added an additional member to our leadership team. This person will focus on building a strong student support team. The team includes SWD Teachers, Interventionist, and ELL teachers.

Governance Committee



Governance Updates

The governance committee has received the resignation of Cindy Brown (Chair) and Harold Bardonille (Treasurer). Cindy and Harold have been instrumental to the leadership of the Board and Perry Street Prep. During their tenure, the school transitioned to being among the highest performing PK-8 schools in the charter sector. Their vision, tenacity and courage ensured that Perry Street Prep continues to nurture and develop young leaders with a rigorous academic curriculum and strong family relationships. Cindy and Harold led the school through among the most tumultuous years, and their leadership and guidance were paramount in ensuring a programmatically, academically, and fiscally viable school that centers around students. We are forever grateful to Cindy and Harold on behalf of the students, families, staff and community of Perry Street Prep.
