PROPOSAL

Early Childhood Academy PCS submits to the DC Public Charter School Board this application to amend its charter agreement by changing the item(s) selected above. If approved, this amendment will be effective on <u>July</u>, 20<u>19</u> (leave blank if this has not been determined).

1. Please provide details on the selected amendment(s) above and describe the requested change(s), including the school's rationale for the proposed changes. Describe any planning that is already underway to prepare for the proposed amendment.

Currently, located in two small and inadequate community centers, Early Childhood Academy (ECA) has sought a more appropriate facility since its opening in 2005. ECA has procured funding and begun construction of a 38,000 sq ft facility that will house its entire population. The new facility is located directly behind the school's current location, literally steps away and is scheduled to be completed in July 2019.

2. How will the proposed amendment(s) support or enhance the school's mission?

The amendment will allow ECA to reach its authorized enrollment capacity of 300 students, which the school is unable to do in its two current locations. It will provide all students with a state-of-the-art facility designed specifically to support the needs of young learners.

3. Please explain what steps, if any, you've taken to address the concerns that prompted a DC PCSB audit, board action, or community complaint.

We have not been subject to any PCSB audits or board actions. In the past three years, we have received three community complaints. In February 2016, a complaint was lodged for an aftercare late fee that a parent was charged when she picked up her child after the 6:00 pm end time for aftercare. The late fee policy was stated in the aftercare hand-book but Mom felt her arrival time was not her fault because of bad weather and did not feel she should have to pay. We explained the policy and the complaint was closed. In July 2016, a complaint was lodged by a parent when a student was incorrectly released to his biological mother during ECA's summer program. We acknowledged the error and put additional safeguards in place to ensure that this did not occur again. In September of 2018, a parent lodged a complaint after her child's special education teacher resigned and a new teacher was not hired within a time period that was satisfactory to the parent. The parent had numerous meetings with the principal to address her concern but ultimately loudly used profane language as she walked through the building, then transferred her child to another school.

The amendment will have a positive impact on the school's fiscal health. The amendment will allow us to eventually increase our enrollment to our maximum capacity of 300 within four years of occupying the new state of the art facility. Although we will have additional expenses for personnel, direct costs and interest expense on the income statement, our projected revenues from per pupil charter payments and federal entitlements will allow us to maintain a positive and healthy bottom line as is projected by our attached 5 years operating budget. Our rent expense will be eliminated and the main and new expense for us is interest expense on the \$18 million loan; this will approximate \$1 million per year for the first seven years after which we will refinance the loan and then make payments of principal and interest over the life of the loan. Our annual FAR, our fiscal financial audit and current financial statements have always shown a healthy bottom line and our conservative operating budget projections reflect positive changes in net assets.

ECA has kept teachers, parents and the community abreast of the school relocation through its website, weekly parent newsletter, email communication, and parent and staff meetings. A groundbreaking event for parents, community members, and stakeholders was held on October 3, 2018. ECA met with the president of the HOA Board for the Walter Washington Estates to apprise him of the construction plans for the school. The Walter Washington Estates is adjacent to the location for the new facility. On April 2, 2018, ECA, along with the architectural firm and general contractor, presented its plans for construction at the ANC 8E meeting held at Eagle Academy.

Early Childhood Academy (ECA) is currently located at 4025 9th Street, SE WDC 20032. Although our school is considered one campus, a second building, which houses some of our classrooms, is located at 4301 9th Street SE. ECA will relocate to 885 Barnaby Street, SE WDC 20032, which is literally across the alley from the current facility. ECA will continue to serve the same grades and maintain the same capacity as approved in the original charter agreement.

3. Is the proposed new facility a property that you plan to purchase or lease? How many square feet is this space? Which grade level(s) will be at this location? If you have already purchased or leased the property, provide specific dates of when the property was acquired.

ECA purchased the property on September 11, 2018. The building includes an existing facility that is being gutted and renovated and a new wing that is being built. The total square footage for the entire new facility is 38,000 square feet. All grade levels, from prekindergarten-3 to grade 3, will be at this new location and ECA will vacate its current locations.

Because the new facility is yards from the current facility (literally behind the current building, across the alley), we anticipate no impact on students who currently attend the school.

b. Given that students are expected to move; how will you support families that need transportation?

The location of the new facility will have no impact on the access of current families.

5. Describe the neighborhood of the proposed location (e.g. residential, commercial, metro-accessibility). What value will you bring to this community? ECA has been a Tier 1 school since the tiering of early childhood program was implemented by the PCSB (2016, 2017, and 2018) and has a three-star rating by OSSE. By remaining in the same community, we are now providing a state-of-the-art facility to our parents who have already entrusted us with the responsibility of providing their children with a high-quality education. We will also bring to the community a new facility that houses a program that has been proven to exceed surrounding schools based on the PCSB's School Quality Report. Within this community is Ferebee Hope, a DCPS that has been closed and vacant for years, Achievement Prep, whose early childhood program has not yet achieved a Tier 1 rating, and Eagle Academy – Wheeler Road, whose program has not yet achieved a Tier 1 rating.

6. Describe how you have engaged <u>your school's</u> community in the decision to relocate, expand, or divide into this new location. Please see attached documentation. ECA has kept teachers, parents and the community abreast of the school's relocation progress through its website, weekly parent newsletter, email communication, and parent and staff meetings. A groundbreaking event for parents, community members, and stakeholders was held on October 3, 2018. There have been no concerns raised by the internal community.

7. Describe all community outreach that has been done in the local community of the new school location. Submit documentation of communications with nearby principals, neighbors, ANC representatives, Councilmembers, and others, notifying them of your plans.

On October 5, 2017, ECA leadership met with Mr. Eugene Wilkerson, president of the HOA for the Walter Washington Estates, which includes homes that are adjacent to the construction site. Mr. Wilkerson expressed



his support and approval of the project. In January 2018, the ECA leadership team began correspondence with Stephen Slaughter, ANC 8E07, to apprise him of the construction plans and solicit his support. Mr. Slaughter arranged for ECA to present at the monthly ANC 8E community meeting on April 2, 2018. The ECA leadership, representatives from the architectural firm of Cox, Graae, & Spack, and representative from the general contracting firm The Menkiti Group presented plans and architectural drawings, and fielded questions and concerns from ANC and community members. The ANC representatives and community members present voted to craft a resolution in support of the project. The ECA website describes that scope of the project and includes photographs that document the construction progress. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on October 3, 2018 at the school. Councilmember Trayon White, Mayor Muriel Bowser, and PCSB Executive Director Scott Pearson were in attendance. Also in attendance were parents, teachers, staff, and community members.

8. Will there be newly-created slots for additional students? If so, discuss student recruitment efforts in the new school community.

ECA will increase its available slots to 300, its approved charter capacity. Recruitment efforts include advertisements on fence wrap that surround the construction site, a large banner at the project site, radio advertisements and community canvassing.

9. What is the occupancy maximum at the new location? If the maximum occupancy load for staff and students is less than the total number of staff and students who will occupy the facility at any point in the future, please explain how you will address this issue.

ECA has 254 students enrolled in its current facility and is planning for full enrollment with 300 students by SY 2021-2022.

- **10.**In addition to providing a <u>5-year Operating Budget</u>, please answer the following questions regarding the financial impact of the proposed new location:
 - a. How much does the proposed new facility cost, and how many students will be served at the new site?

The new facility will cost \$18 million and will ultimately serve 300 students. In the first year of the new school, i.e. fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 the budgeted enrollment is 285 students, with 290 in fiscal year 2021; 300 in fiscal year 2022 and in subsequent years.

b. What is the school's per-pupil cost, and how does this compare with its per-pupil allowance?

ECA's per pupil total cost was \$4,389,574 for the 17-18 school year. ECA received a total per pupil allowance of \$4,554,059. The total projected per pupil cost is \$4,644,492 for the 18-19 school year compared to ECA's projected allowance of \$4,938,449.



c. If you plan to operate multiple facilities, in addition to the proposed new location, what is the LEA's total facilities cost (e.g. lease, plus mortgage)? How does this expense compare with your per-pupil allowance?

ECA doesn't plan to operate multiple facilities.

 d. What additional sources of funding do you plan to use to pay for this new facility.

ECA obtained funding through New Market Tax Credits (NMTC). This funding consists of a master loan in the principal amount of \$15,600,000. As part of the transaction, ECAPCS formed the ECA Support Corporation to meet the necessary structuring requirements to qualify for the NMTC. The ECA Support Corporation is a nonprofit corporation formed under the laws of the District of Columbia. The agreement was established to fund the development and construction of the new school facility. ECA also obtained a loan in the amount of \$2,000,000 from the District of Columbia through the Office of Public Charter School Financing within the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE). ECA also was awarded a \$750,000 SOAR grant from OSSE for the purchase and installation of the HVAC system in the new building.

e. If applicable, what contingencies do you have in place in case the new location enrolls fewer students than anticipated?

We plan to conservatively budget for a gradual student enrollment of 250, 285, 290 and then 300 over the next four years beginning with 2019, this coupled with a new facility and third year of Tier 1 status allows us to plan for any contingencies. Additionally, ECA has \$3 million in reserve to address any unexpected short-falls.

Executive Director Report by Wendy Edwards

Facilities

Karl Jentoft of TenSquare, LLC has been in negotiations on behalf of the ECA Board of Trustees
to develop a contract with the Menkiti Group for the development of 885 Barnaby Street, SE
based on feedback received from the board's Facilities Committee. The final draft of the contract
is attached.

Action: ECA's Board of Trustees unanimously approved the Letter of Intent to proceed with the contract development of 885 Barnaby Street, SE, with provisions to include adding warranty language to the lease.

- On Thursday, April 14, 2016 the DC Baptist Convention (DCBC) Board of Trustees met with Dennis Sawyers, James Williams, Debra Foster, and Thann Ingraham to discuss their proposal to increase ECA rent by 109% for school year 2016-2017, and which would require ECA to assume the cost for all needed repairs to the building. Participants from ECA explained the hardship this increase would place on the school. Wendy followed up with a letter reiterating concern about the proposal, which the DCBC issued a response by email today stating that the DCBC committee met on April 25th to make their decision about the 2016-2017 lease.
- Wendy contacted Jennie Niles, Deputy Mayor for Education; Scott Pearson, ED of DC Public Charter School Board; and Tom Porter of Building Hope to inquire about possible relocation to nearby Ferebee Hope Elementary School for the two year period during which the new facility is under construction. No definitive answer has been received from Jennie Niles, however Tom

Porter has been in contact with the DC Department of General Services in an attempt to gain access to the Ferebee Hope building for a walkthrough.

Action: James will check on whether a DC code exist to prevent a commercial landlord from increasing the rent 109%. The board will look into entering into a one year lease with option to renew, and work toward getting an audience with the Deputy Mayor while continuing to work toward occupying Ferebee Hope for 2 years. Also, the board will consult with a commercial real estate attorney to guide us on our possible options. Wendy plans to reach out to Jennie Niles again and HR Crawford.

Suggestions were made by Dennis and Debra Foster to search for nearby spaces that would allow us to move into portable trailers/mobile units (i.e. the WW tennis court) in lieu of the DCBC not notifying us within 90 days of lease end. Also, Eric suggested negotiating to pull out of the lease with DCBC for 2016-2017.

Request for Proposal

• ECA has had an IT vacancy since January 2016. In an effort to fill the requirements of this position, a notice of intent was posted in the DC Register, Washington Times, and DC City Paper on Mar 25th. Request for proposals will be received through Monday, May 2, 2016.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT by Thann Ingraham

PARCC Assessment

Third grade students of Early Childhood Academybegan taking the Partnership for the
Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) on Monday, April 18, 2016. The
final day for testing is Wednesday, April 27, 2016. The results of the PARCC assessment will be
used in DC PCSB's Performance Management Framework (PMF), which annually evaluates the
school's academic performance.

Teacher Search for 2016-2017 School Year

• ECA is currently seeking qualified teacher candidates for preK-3 through grade 3 as well as special education for the upcoming 2016-2017 school year. Although the school is currently fully staffed, teachers are being requested to submit an Intent to Return document indicating whether or not they plan to return to ECA for the following school year.

Financial Report by Debra Foster

• The Statement of Financial Position as of March 31, 2016 shows total assets of \$5,278,073 which represent a 9% increase over the prior year's \$4,855,913. Current assets consist of \$5,184,050 of total assets, a 10% increase over the prior year's \$4,724,877; and total cash as of March 31, 2016 of \$4,964,148, a 10% increase over the prior year's \$4,523,449. Total liabilities of \$130,522 increased by \$60.695, which was an 87% increase mostly due to accounts payables and timing of payments. All liabilities are short-term; there is no long-term debt. Net assets for this nine months period were \$5,147,551 which is up 8% from the prior year's net assets of \$4,786,218.

• The Statement of Activities for the end of the third quarter of our fiscal year 2015-16 shows total income of \$4,152,149 a less than 1% decrease from the prior year's income of \$4,163,641. The change represents a decrease in per pupil funding and grant revenue over prior year due to a timing difference with invoicing NCLB Entitlement and other grants. Total expenses were \$3,369,999 an increase of 8% over the prior year's expenses of \$3,129,553. This increase represents increases in salaries with related fringes, advertising and recruiting expenses for enrollment and hiring of teachers and also occupancy costs and PCSB administrative fees.

Overall, we continue to have a strong balance sheet with a current ratio of 39.71 to 1 in current year and 67.79 to 1 in prior period.
